ORDER

1. Present complaint has been filed by Mr. Kasif Amin against BYPL-CCK.
2. The brief facts of the case giving rise to this grievance are that complainant Mr. Kasif Amin, purchased property no. 3188, GF, Gali Azzuudin Wali, G.B. Road, Delhi where already an electricity connection is installed vide CA No. 151495126. He further submitted

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


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that respondent transferred dues amounting to Rs. 296991.47/- to his connection. He requested the Forum to direct the respondent for immediate removal of transferred dues and restoration of his electricity supply.

3. The OP in their reply briefly stated that the complainant has challenged bill dated 29.12.2019 raised in the name of Mohd Faizal bearing CA No. 151495126 which was energized in the year 2015 and was disconnected on 18.12.2017 on account of non-payment of dues.

OP further added that in the same property there was another connection bearing CA No. 100304064, in the name of brother of Mohd Faizal i.e. Mohd Ashraf. At the time of disconnection of electricity connection in the name of Mohd Faizal an amount of Rs. 403643/- were outstanding. As the meter against CA No. 151495126 was disconnected on account of non-payment of dues as such meter was not sent to lab for testing.

4. Arguments of both the parties were heard.
5. The counsel of the complainant argued that the bill of Mohd Faizal is illegal and arbitrarily high and needs revision.
6. The LR of the OP submitted that property bearing no. 3188 and 3187 are adjoining properties. On ground floor of property bearing 3188 disconnected connection existed. The said connection was in name of Mohd Faisal and was disconnected on outstanding of Rs. 403643/- on 18.12.2017. On 03.06.2022, site was visited and it was found that the property which was earlier electrified through disconnected connection was now getting electricity through live connection registered in the name of complainant by way of illegal extension.

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7. The main issue in the present complaint is whether the dues raised by OP are correct and payable by the complainant or not.
8. From the perusal of material placed on record it is evident that the complainant is defaulter in making bill payment. In view of the above, we are of considered opinion that the bill raised by OP is correct and payable by the complainant. Complainant also failed to provide concrete evidence to prove their contention that the meter was faulty which resulted into abnormal billing. Therefore, the complainant's contention is rejected

ORDER


The complaint is rejected. The bill raised by the OP is correct and payable by the complainant.

OP is also directed file compliance report within 21 days of this order.


Case is disposed off as above.

No order as to the cost. Both the parties should be informed accordingly.
